CONDITIONS OF ENTRY:

1. This shipment shall be accompanied by a Phytosanitary Certificate issued by a duly authorized Plant Quarantine Officer of the country of origin and must be absolutely free from soil.
2. Immediately upon arrival of said plant materials at the port of entry they are to be turned over to the Plant Quarantine Service for inspection.
3. None of the above-described plant materials may be released at the port of entry unless cleared by the Plant Quarantine Officer thereat.
4. If the plant materials are found upon inspection to be infested with pests or infected with any plant disease that they can not be phytosanitized by any treatment available, they may be destroyed, and such destruction can not be made the basis of a claim for damages against the Bureau of Plant Industry.
5. Corresponding fees for inspection, treatment, etc., shall be paid by the importer prior to release of said plant materials.

OTHER CONDITIONS:

PRE-SHIPMENT REQUIREMENTS:

1. The consignment should be free from any sign and symptom of plant pests and other regulated articles.
2. The accompanying Phytosanitary Certificate should have an additional declaration that the consignment has been "sourced from a pest free place of production" or "tested and found to be free" from *Trichodorus* sp.
3. Treat with appropriate fungicide and insecticide at recommended rates. Details of such treatment should be stated in the accompanying Phytosanitary Certificate.
4. The SPS Import Clearance (SPS IC) number should be stated in the accompanying Phytosanitary Certificate.

POST-ENTRY REQUIREMENTS:

1. Consignment should be inspected by a Plant Quarantine Officer at the Port of Entry for verification of documents and for presence of quarantine pests. If found infected/infested, the consignment shall be destroyed and disposed in accordance with the standard quarantine procedures.
